#### -Printable PDFs

We have renamed the "Library" page "Printable PDFs" to make it clear what the page contains. We will consider changing "Service Dog Lifestyle" to something that conveys more clearly to the general public what the category contains.

## -You Can Help!

Instead of having a link to the "Donate" page as the last link on the header, we have a link to a new "You Can Help!" page. The "You Can Help!" page has descriptions of and links to the donate page, the "Personal Impact" page, and our "Advocacy" page.

In the "Personal Impact" section, we will add stories to the website about how PSDP has helped individuals, from their point of view. These would be 1–2 medium-sized paragraphs plus a picture.

## -Advocacy

The "Advocacy" page has been updated to reflect the engagement and encouragement we want to have available for our website visitors. This includes letting people know they can help by referencing our "There Are No Fake Vests" statement in comments on news stories that mention CCI's petition or pledge (or politely write directly to CCI):
